APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR NEW-LOOK SOUTH AUSTRALIAN LITERARY AWARDS

The State Library of South Australia is proud to unveil the new-look 2024 South Australian Literary Awards, with applications now open for the state's highest literary honour.

The biennial Awards celebrate Australia's diverse writing culture by offering national and state-based literary prizes across a range of genres, as well as three fellowships for South Australian writers.

State Library of South Australia Director Geoff Stempel said, "The 2024 South Australian Literary Awards herald a new era of the Awards in line with the State Library's strategic direction with the unveiling of a fresh look and new name.

"The new-look Awards shines a light on the best writing talent both here in South Australia and nationally, while also supporting the literary community.

"As the custodian of stories, we're calling on South Australian authors and writers to share their stories for their chance to vie for the state's highest literary honour."

Arts Minister Andrea Michaels said the Malinauskas Government is committed to supporting South Australian authors.

"South Australia is renowned for its brilliant creative minds and the South Australian Literary Awards provides a boost to authors to propel their literature careers."

Jointly funded by the Government of South Australia and the Libraries Board of South Australia, the South Australian Literary Awards offer a total prize pool of \$167,500 across six national and five South Australian categories, including the coveted Premier's Award worth \$25,000 for the overall winner.

- Jill Blewett Playwright's Award (\$12,500)
- Arts South Australia Wakefield Press Unpublished Manuscript Award (\$10,000)
- Barbara Hanrahan Fellowship (\$15,000)
- Max Fatchen Fellowship (\$15,000)
- Tangkanungku Pintyanthi Fellowship (\$15,000)

Applications must be submitted by 5pm, Friday 15 December 2023.

An independent judging panel will assess all categories with a shortlist announced in July 2024. Winning authors will be announced at a ceremony in the State Library's Mortlock Chamber in November 2024.
