Edward Howard Bakewell (1859-1944) was educated at Prince Alfred College and after working as a ledger keeper became involved in the pastoral industry through management of Elder's stock department, J.H. Angas' stations and Willowie Land & Pastoral Company. The first Company in which he became a partner in his own right in 1896 was the South Australian Portland Cement Company. There followed investment and directorships of numerous pastoral and manufacturing companies and of ostrich farms at Port Augusta and Noarlunga.

Bakewell was president of the Australian National League 1907-10, president of the Pastoralists Association of South Australia 1916-18, president of the South Australian Employers Federation 1915-29 and Chairman of the Municipal Tramways Trust 1922-37.
