



PORT AUGUSTA

The Town, situated 27 miles from Adelaide, was discovered from a hill, named by the Discoverer as Mount St. Augustin, April 1836.

During spring tides, strong South winds blowing from the sea, the water rises to 10 feet above the level of the sea, and the water is very muddy.
